Mayor leads the Borough in remembrance

Remembrance Sunday

On Remembrance Sunday the Mayor and Mayoress attended a service of Memorial at Bromley Parish Church, which included a 2-minute silence and the sounding of 'The Last Post'. They were joined by Sir Bob Neill MP, the Deputy Lieutenant Colonel RW Murfin TD DL, the Chief Executive Ade Adetosoye OBE and other Borough dignitaries. Following the memorial service, the Civic party processed up to the War Memorial, stopping along the route to receive a salute from the March past. When the party arrived at the war memorial, the Mayor led the wreath-laying ceremony.

The Deputy Mayor and Deputy Mayoress attended the Act of Remembrance at Orpington War Memorial to observe the 2-minute silence. Wreaths were laid at the memorial before those taking part marched up to All Saints Church for a Memorial Service. The congregation then processed out of the graveyard and paused at the grave of Ivy Millichamp – the last person to die by enemy actions in these islands during the second world war. The party then moved on to lay wreaths at Canadian Corner to honour the many Canadian soldiers from the First World War who are buried there.



Armistice Day

The Mayor led the Borough in an act of remembrance with a short but moving service at Bromley War Memorial on Thursday 11th November.

The Deputy Mayor was also in attendance and a wreath was laid to mark Armistice Day.



Mayoral Engagements

The Mayor was delighted to present certificates to the 2020/2021 Street Sweeper of the year recipient along with this year's nominees. The Mayor was honoured to be able to personally thank those who undertake this very hard and sometimes undervalued job.



On Thursday 21st October the Mayor visited Mrs. Elizabeth Piekarski at the Antokol Polish Care home in Chislehurst to celebrate her 100th Birthday.

As a child Mrs. Piekarski lived with her parents in Poland, and in 1939 experienced the Nazi occupation of Poland and subsequently the invasion of Russian military forces. In spite of all the horrendous experiences she endured, her mind is still active, being able to recount the horrors which both armies inflicted upon the people, her own family having been deported to Siberia.



Elizabeth has contributed to a book which gives a graphic account of her travails and the efforts of the Polish survivors who under General Anders, formed a new army

to oppose the Germans, with notable achievements in the Syrian and Italian campaigns. Elizabeth trained as a Red Cross nurse and was thus able to tend her wounded fellow countrymen.

Her account is of primary importance as a person who witnessed the effects of war and will last as a fitting reminder of the inhumanity man can inflict on his fellow beings.

On Saturday 9th October the Deputy Mayor attended a memorial concert for Celia and Ernest Yeo, supporters of the Bromley Festival of Music over many years, which was held in Bromley Parish Church.

The concert featured many young musicians playing a variety of instruments including brass, harp, piano, strings and woodwind. It also featured recitals of 'I Tried to Do My Homework' by Ken Nesbitt and 'Sea Fever' by John Masefield. Cllr Tony Owen handed out certificates to each performer and commented 'I was hugely impressed by the array of young talent who have entertained us so beautifully.'



The Mayor attended the Beckenham Firework Display on Saturday 6th November which was held at the Croydon Road Recreation Ground. The display was fantastic with around 5,000 people attending. Indeed, such was the public interest in the display that the surrounding roads became completely gridlocked.

This marvellous event was hosted and organised by the 5th Beckenham Scout Group in support of various local charities in Bromley and proved to be a truly family occasion.



On Thursday 18th November, the Deputy Mayor was pleased to visit an Information Pod that was set up to mark Self-care week in the Glades Shopping Centre. The Deputy Mayor helped to hand out plenty of the new Flow Flex SARS-CoV-1 Antigen Rapid Test kits which are used in the nose only. During his visit, he also recorded a short website message to be broadcast at a later time.

On Sunday 12th September the Deputy Mayor was delighted to support a charity fundraising event for Bromley Down Syndrome Support Group in the form of an Old Tyme Music Hall evening. This was jointly organised at the Churchill Theatre by the Rotary Club of Park Langley and West Wickham Operatic Society.

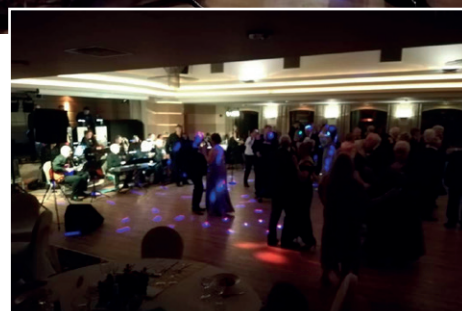
The Mayor attended an award ceremony on Monday 8th November to honour and celebrate the achievements of members of the Bromley, Croydon and Sutton Police.
